## **Project Meetings**

The fourth and last transnational project meeting took place in Florence. The meeting was hosted by the Unione Italiana Ciechi ed Ipovedenti Sezione Provinciale di Firenze, the coordinator of the project. Representatives from all partner organizations joined the meeting, reflected on what has been done (e.g. the multiligual guide for ADD@ME ONLINE TRIVIAL GAME FOR VI AMBASSADORS) and took decisions for the last local multiplier events.

#### The final conference

The final conference took place in Biblioteca delle Oblate in Florence, Italy. In the course of this multiplier event participated 40 people which received detailed information regarding the project and the three Intellectual Outputs.

## **Workshops in Florence-Italy**

The Unione Italiana Ciechi ed Ipovedenti Sezione Provinciale di Firenze organized workshops entitle "Visual Disability Awareness workshop" on 24<sup>th</sup> of September 2022 at Circolo Baragli. The participants took place in in experiential workshops with a goal to get familiarized themselves with the way to accompany a blind person, the wat that a blind can play sports and









assistivies technologies used by people with vision impairments.

## Multiplier event in Romania

The Ofensiva Tinerilor the Romanian partner of the project ADD@ME, on the 6<sup>th</sup> of October, organized a multiplier event. The multiplier event was attended by many teachers and educators from educational institutions in the municipality and county, who now have access to the dedicated Add@Me platform.

# Multiplier event in Poland

The POLISH ASSOCIATION OF THE BLIND, the Polish partner of the project, organized a multiplier event at Warsaw. 32 stakeholders, representatives of other organisations active in the field of blindness and visual impairment and academic teachers, pedagogues (working with the blind youth as well), visually impaired students and pupils and all people working with the blind or interested in the theme of the









blindness attended the multiplier event. The event included presentations, but there was also the time for the audience's feedback, some interactive time when participants could present themselves or share their thoughts about the project's IOs.

## **Workshops in Greece**

The University of Thessaly, the Greek partner of the project organized workshops regarding vision impairment entitled "Experiential workshops on vision impairment" on Saturday 22 of October 2022 at the Central Building of University of Thessaly. 46 primary school teachers and teachers of special educational settings participated in the workshops. The workshops included experiential activities related to visual impairment, approaching the world through the senses, accompanying blind people as well as developing leadership skills.

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## Multiplier event in Spain

The Fundación Docete Omnes, the Spanish partner of the project organized a multiplier event entitled "Empoderar a los jóvenes con discapacidad visual para convertirlos en Actores Clave en los procesos concernientes a su propia Inclusión Social a nivel europeo" on 24th of October 2022 at La Blanca Paloma VET centre in La Zubia (Granada). The participants were 37 professionals and students such as social Integration students and teachers, youth workers, psychologists, pedagogues, SES, and other supporting staff, dealing with people with disabilities. included presentation and The event discussion regarding issues such as how their social services works in Spain, their connection with other institutions across Europe, and the use of technology in education of visually impaired people.

## **Workshops in Belgium**

The Belgian partner, Views International organized three multiplier events for distinct









profiles of participants. All events took place in Liège end of October 2022. The first one took place at IRHOV; 11 students and teachers of the School for the participated in this workshop. The second one was at a local Highschool, Jean Boets. A mixed group of 16 teenagers and youth workers attended this workshop. The third multiplier event organized at a local ngo, La Baraka, where 15 young adults and youth workers participated in the workshops. All events had a theoretical introductory part of the project and it's outcomes and a more practical session related to playing the Online Trivial game and experimenting some of the methods listed under the Mobile toolkit for visually impaired ambassadors."
